Room updates...







Throughout November the Babies have really got into exploring with their senses. They used their whole bodies to make marks in paint, enjoying the feeling of the squidgy paint and making marks. *Expressive arts and design, physical development*. In keeping with the sensory exploration theme the Babies also explored the marks that they made with paint underneath cling film on the table. Chloe and Lisa used lots of descriptive language as they played including 'squishy, slimy, cold and splat' *Communication and Language, physical*

development. The Babies have enjoyed dressing up and engaging in roleplay activities this month including transforming themselves into builders, princesses and cats. Expressive arts and design. Children in need bought with it lots of opportunities, and the babies enjoyed using Lisa's Pudsey cutter to make Pudsey bear biscuits, getting sticky and decorating Pudsey pictures and colouring them too! Expressive arts and design, physical development, personal, social and emotional development. They also loved getting stuck into icky sticky jelly, using their hands to squeeze the jelly. They also had lots of fun using plastic knives and forks to chop and scoop the jelly, showing great hand eye co-ordination. Physical development, expressive arts and design, communication and language - listening. The best part about all of the crisp sunny weather we've been having has been the chance to get outside, playing with the autumn leaves, watching the chickens and playing on the large play equipment. Physical development. Understanding of the world, personal social and emotional development.





















With winter definitely on its way but the sunshine making a very welcome appearance the toddlers have enjoyed spending time outside in their wet weather suits and wellies. Splashing in puddles, playing with crunchy autumn leaves and playing football have been very popular. *Understanding the world, physical development, personal social and emotional development.* They have loved making it snow indoors by clapping their hands and sending shaving foam flying into the air. *Expressive arts and design.* Using the foam shapes to make

patterns, and talk about shape and colour was a hit, and the children loved sharing their patterns with each other. *Maths - shape, space and measure, personal, social*



and emotional development. The toddlers also loved getting stuck in with gooey angel delight play, letting it ooze through their fingers, with the staff encouraging lots of descriptive language. Expressive arts and design, communication and language. Icky sticky jelly was also the name of the game with the children exploring the texture with their fingers, and using roleplay cutlery to chop the jelly into pieces. The staff used lots of descriptive words like sticky, wobbly, smell, and gooey



to encourage the children to share how it felt. *Communication and language, expressive arts and design, physical development.*

















Throughout November the Preschool children have been working together on lots of different tasks, learning how to reach goals as a team and support each other. Emma, Becky and Amy set up a table at an angle and encouraged the children to roll vehicles down the table to see how the angle at which the table sits affects the speed that the vehicles travel. They had lots of fun racing each other's cars and guessing who's cars would reach the bottom first. Maths-shape, space and measure, communication and language, personal social and emotional development. As always, they have loved exploring the roleplay area, helping each other to put on different costumes and assume different characters within their play. With roleplay in mind there is also nothing better than a cardboard box to accessorize any roleplay scenario, and the



children have loved hiding in the boxes and using them as props or vehicles. Expressive arts and design, communication and language, personal social and emotional development. Taking turns to read each other stories has also been a popular choice, and the children have sat very nicely with each other handling the books very carefully as they turn the pages. Literacy - reading, communication and language, personal social and emotional development. Engaging in problem solving games on the preschool room computer has also been lots of fun, using their technology skills to match shapes, colours and numbers. They have also really enjoyed colour matching and pattern creating with the pegboards and counting

jewels to correspond with laminated numbers. *Maths – Number, understanding the world – technology, communication and language – understanding.* They have also been developing their artistic skills, and drawing portraits and other pictures with their fingers in dry porridge oats. *Physical development, expressive arts and design.*

A reminder about your child's bag....

I would like to ask that we take careful consideration when packing children's bags for nursery. As a parent I understand that everything other than the kitchen sink usually goes into your child's day bag. When you are out and about it is good to be prepared for all eventualities, however not all these items are safe in the hands of children.

Upon inspecting children's bags, I found an array of items that could be harmful to children for various reasons. Within some of the nursery rooms bags are accessible to the children so we would like to urge you not to put anything in your child's bag that could be potentially dangerous. Bottles, spare clothes, comforters, nappies and wet wipes are all we need. Any other items such as medications or creams should be given to a member of staff.
