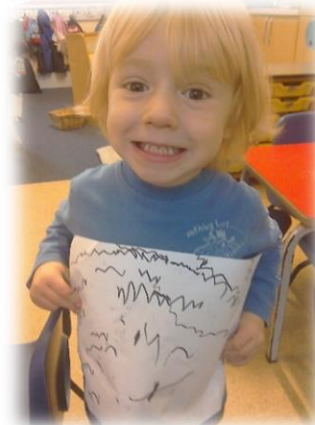

After carving a pumpkin the children filled it with bicarbonate of soda and vinegar and were astonished by what happened. The children found it so amusing we ended up repeating the experiment several times using up 3 bottles of vinegar.



The children have been using the centimetre cubes and Lego to create various models and enjoyed completing some new puzzles. The children have been practising their mark making skills attempting to form letters and lines as well as practising number recognition and counting. Emma brought in some paint rollers and the children had great fun making water marks on the walls fence and floors.
