Room updates.....



May has been a month full of messy fun and frolics! The Babies have been delving in with all five of their senses. They have been smelling shaving foam, and feeling the fluffy squelchy textures. Textures were the name of the game, with activities such as gooey sensory bags, and angel delight



play with spoons. As we said goodbye to Gemma in the baby room this month Lisa set about creating a handprint masterpiece for Gemma to treasure with some tiny 'helping hands'. As the weather has been so lovely the babies have really been able to benefit from it. They have been exploring sand and water outside, climbing, and sliding down the slide, playing peekaboo in the tunnels and swaying back and forth together on the seesaw. Some of the Babies have also taken a real interest in dressing and changing dollies nappies before putting them to bed under a cosy blanket. These activities link to Physical doubles many costs and design and personal costal and emotional double



development, expressive arts and design, and personal, social and emotional development.







Tthroughout May the Toddlers have been exploring nature, and the ways in which they can use natural resources. They decorated big stones with PVA glue and a variety of leaves. One of their favourite activities has been drawing around one of their friends, and decorating the outline with leaves, twigs and moss. They have also been watching the nesting blue tits closely to see how they are getting on.

With the continued lovely weather indoor play has been taken outdoors on a daily basis, with activities like sticking, painting and building and balancing with the soft play. Lots of messy play has also been the aim of the game with activities like coloured spaghetti play, sponge painting, gloop and threading with cheerios and dry spaghetti. These activities link to understanding of the world, physical development and expressive arts and design.





This month preschool had a whale of a time creating their very own 'Diamond Café' in the room with table cloths, menus and flowers on every table! The children enjoyed serving each other and ordering what they wanted to eat from the menu. The took inside play out and created their very own classroom in the playground, with the role



play area, mark making and small world activities. They have all loved engaging in role play activities such as water play with the pirate ship, and dressing up time. They have explored textures with the toy diggers in the sand and mud, and exploring ice as it melted, using pipettes to move the water around. They loved developing their hand eye co-ordination and colour matching skills by sorting coloured buttons with funnels. These activities link to expressive arts and design, communication and language and personal social and emotional development.





The week commencing 6th June marks the Queens 90th Birthday. We will be joining in the celebrations all week with activities such as baking cakes, making union jack flags, wearing red white and blue and making our very own crowns.
