Over the last few months in the baby room, we have been having lots of fun making marks and exploring different messy play. We have explored lots of edible messy play from edible playdoh, edible sand (digestive biscuits crushed up), baked bean play and cornflour just to name a few. We have also enjoyed some of our favourite activities of shaving foam where we got very messy and had lots of fun covering ourselves and Lisa, painting and water play. We have also been having lots of fun out in the garden where we have been exploring the sand filling and emptying containers and making lots of sand castles. We have also enjoyed playing on the large play equipment such as the cars and bikes and climbing on the climbing frame whilst watching out for aeroplanes flying past.

Over the next few weeks we will be working on lots of painting and sticking activities to do with changing our display within the baby room. It's also that time of year when we start to say goodbye to some of our babies that will be moving up to the toddler room so we will be looking at doing settling in sessions for them whilst also welcoming new children to the baby room.

















Toddler room



In Toddlers we have been super busy over the few months, exploring our Summer theme, where we used our creative skills and imagination to make our beautiful display board.

This then lead us to exploring 'under the sea' we had great fun dancing to different music and pretending to be different sea creatures. We loved reading the story 'Octopus Shockedapus,' and we were able to join in parts of the story - we even made our very own Octopus like the one in the book, by getting very messy with paper mâché then painting it orange.





We had great fun on our sensory walk, we used a selection of different textures to explore by walking barefoot across them, some of the textures where: cornflakes, shaving foam, a duplo board and warm water.

We encouraged the children to describe how each texture felt, we then helped to promote independence by putting on our own socks and shoes.



Our favourite book that we have read over the last few weeks has been 'Wash your hands Mr Panda.' All of us now know the words to this story and we will often find our little ones take great care and enjoyment in reading it to their friends. This book has reminded us the importance of washing our hands and using please and thank you, just like Mr Panda.









Preschool

Recently in preschool, we have been very busy with our learning activities. We have loved our maths week where we practised counting different objects, sorting numbers into groups with pom poms, we used tweezers and counting cups and have also enjoyed practising writing our numbers. Following on from this, preschool have also enjoyed looking at shapes. We have done various activities involving shapes from drawing them to matching them and also looking around to find different shapes in the environment. Some of us have shown an interest in learning about new shapes such as pentagons, hexagons and octagons.

Pre school have also enjoyed getting crafty. We have explored different ways of using paints with toothbrushes, we have done gluing and sticking with tissue paper and using pens and pencils to decorate objects.

Preschool have also done lots of different sensory/ messy play trays. We have done cous cous play both dry and wet, we have explored different textures of shaving foam and have also got very messy with gloop.

Additional Information

Medication:

We understand that all children will get ill at some point and this can cause a strain on everyone within the house hold. In order for us to stop the spread of illness we ask that if your child needs Calpol or if they have had any within 4 hours of starting nursery please keep them at home. If your child is prescribed any eye drops, antibiotics, steroids or any other medicated creams etc they will need to remain off for 24 hours. Once they have passed 24 hours then as long as we have a prescription label then we are able to administer the medication. If you are unsure please speak to the member of the team.

End of the Day

As you are all aware as a setting we operate 745-6pm. This means we close the doors at 6pm, if you require a handover at the end of the day please arrive by <u>5.50pm</u> so that staff have time to do the handover. If you arrive after this time, handover will be short and limited. Any collections after 6pm will occur a fee.

Car park

We just want to ask that people take a slower approach when entering the car park. Please remember that at any time, parents could be dropping or collecting their child, meaning there are children around.

Could people also remember to park respectively to allow as many vehicles as possible to park and to ensure children are transported safely in and out of the setting by not blocking the gate. Thankyou for all your support!!
